(A), as long as you don't stand around on the coals, you will not get burned. Think of a cake in a 230°C oven. The air, the cake and the pan are all at 230°C, but only the metal pan will burn your hand. Air has very low heat capacity and also low conductivity, so you can put your hand in the oven long enough to touch the cake. The heat capacity of the cake is a lot higher than air, but since it has low conductivity you can briefly touch it without getting burned. (B), the metal pan has a heat capacity similar to the cake, but high conductivity. If you touch it, you will get burned.

Augusta Savage was an eminent artist. Born in Florida in 1892, she moved to New York, where her artistic career flourished. In New York, she enhanced her artistic ability with an education at Cooper Union, a fine arts school that charged no tuition. While at the school, she received requests to make a bust of W.E.B. Du Bois, the African American leader who founded the NAACP, a political association for "colored people." Through this work, Augusta Savage gained fame. She also proved herself to be an influential artist by teaching art to African American children. As the first director of the Harlem Community Art Center, she inspired children, many of whom are now famous artists. Savage spent nearly all of her time helping children, causing some people to criticize her own artwork as suffering in quality.

War is a balance of ends and means: a general might have the best plan to achieve a certain end, but unless he has the means to accomplish it, his plan is worthless. (①) Wise generals through the ages, then, have learned to begin by examining the means they have at hand and then to develop their strategy out of those tools. The festival is also celebrated by Buddhists of Nepal, particularly the Newar Buddhists. According to another theory it may have originated as a harvest festival, marking the last harvest of the year before winter. In an agrarian society this results in businessmen closing accounts, and beginning a new accounting year. The Goddess of wealth in Hinduism, Lakshmi, is therefore thanked on this day and everyone prays for a good year ahead. This is the common factor in Diwali celebrations all over the Indian subcontinent.
